



A LEVEL HISTORY

We study Tudor England and the development of the USSR.



From the AQA Syllabus, AS students study:

The Tudors: England 1485-1603

- How did Henry VII come to power?
- Who was the most important of the Tudor monarchs?
- What was the impact of the Tudors on English society?

Revolution and Dictatorship: Russia and the Soviet Union, 1917-1953

- How did the Bolsheviks come to power?
- How far did Stalin continue with Lenin's policies?
- What was the impact of Stalin on Soviet society?

Assessment is by examination and coursework; both papers being worth 40% of the A level. As the examinations use sources and direct students to question the reliability of sources, it builds directly on the experience the students had at GCSE. Progression onto A Level History will require at least 5 GCSEs or equivalent, at grade B or above and students would preferably have achieved a B at GCSE English Language.
